Human trafficking is the exploitation-by force, coercion, or deception - of one person by another for labor or sex. It is an estimated \$150 billion industry that exists in every country and enslaves over 40 million people.

Considering the hidden nature of trafficking, experts agree, these statistics are estimates at best and the actual numbers of those enslaved may be even higher. In 2016, the number of people enslaved grew by 14 million. Experts cite growing income disparity, natural disasters, and the inability for the poorest of the poor to have economic opportunities and self-agency as factors in this growth/ in the growth of human trafficking.

Countries with the highest absolute numbers of people in modern slavery are India, China, Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Uzbekistan. These countries provide low-cost labor that produces consumer goods for overseas markets—Western Europe, Japan, North America, and Australia. Women and girls account for 71% of trafficking victims. According to the U.S. Department of Labor, 68% of raw materials, such as, cotton, cocoa, and coffee are produced by using forced or child labor.

Our programs are working and we are making a significant impact on the ground in the trafficking hotspots in Cambodia, Haiti, Hong Kong, India, Dominican Republic, and Ghana as we partner with local non-profits in those regions. Our arts curriculum serves as a great tool that helps effectively build skills, lift survivors' spirits, and cultivate self-confidence and self-esteem while providing survivors with a fundraising mechanism utilizing their own creativity.

This year, we launched the Beauty for Freedom Design Academy Program in NYC for high school and college students and we are currently working towards publishing our first Photography Book called "Illuminate: India" from the photography lessons we taught to the survivors in Kolkata, India.

We have the brightest and most committed individuals on our team from the arts and photography fields who travel with us and empower survivors of human trafficking via our arts curriculum. We teach survivors some vital skills that will assist them in gaining employment and living more independent and empowered lives.

Having our roots in the ethical fashion movement, many beauty and fashion brands are joining this movement by partnering with us and supporting our programming and campaigns and in the process enhancing their brand value. Our domestic partners that are on the frontlines of the fight against human trafficking are greatly benefitting.

For example, our Keep the Girls Safe Campaign, a partnership with Cambodia NGO together1heart, Prinkshop and Parson's School of Design raised funds and awareness for the fight to end trafficking in SE Asia with over 150,000 media impressions and the celebrity support of Susan Sarandon, AnnaLynne McCord, Serinda Swan and Diandra Forrest and was featured on FOX News, The Observer and Huffington Post.

In furtherance of our mission our goals for 2017 are to strengthen our fundraising and programming and secure more valuable partnerships with brands and organizations that are like-minded and whose mission align with ours.

With your support and our commitment we are confident that we can fight and end human trafficking and create a freer and better world for our future generations and help improve victims and survivors lives.





Beauty for Freedom exists to empower survivors and at-risk youth of trafficking through creative expression and art therapy. We work to bring about community awareness on the issue of human trafficking and engage community to help improve lives of victims and survivors. We focus on skill development and improving self-esteem for victims/survivors.

We work in areas where there are high instances of human trafficking. Our activities focus on empowering women whereby they develop courage to stand up against their abusers and learn to protect their children from being trafficked. Additionally, the Art and Creative Therapy provide opportunities for survivors to discover new talents, interests, and strengths while their recovery and reintegration process in underway.

Our program participants create their own artworks. Although their art making journeys are not always pleasant and remind them of their traumatic experiences, they still keep going and complete their art projects successfully/ with much passion. This whole process gives them a great sense of joy and pride. They become more confident and motivated. They achieve greater clarity about their interests and goals, learn skills, and achieve a more positive self-image and improved self-esteem.



CREATIVITY

BFF curricula are expressive and creative in nature. Our creative courses aim to help survivors find a form of expression beyond words or traditional therapy.

Creative therapy is as limitless as the imagination in finding appropriate modes of expression. Our teachings include art, music, filmmaking and photography workshops.

Creative art experiences can give survivors an opportunity to accept and integrate their traumatic experiences into a larger context of the purpose for their lives.

CONFIDENCE BUILDING

BFF's mission is to promote individual empowerment and personal creative development in the arts to underserved youth and survivors. Beauty for Freedom leads with a fresh approach of self-worth, empowerment and self-expression.


Helping survivors realize the beauty of living life as a survivor, rather than hiding this aspect of their life narrative, can motivate them towards living with passion to accomplish life goals and even help others by teaching acceptance and tolerance.

This builds confidence and empowers youth to know their full potential.

COMMUNITY

Working with our on-the-ground support/
non-profit partners, we supplement survivors'
educational curriculums and recovery
programming to bring the youth closer to
their communities through artistic expression.

The BFF curriculum & workshops teach life skills to youth and their mentors while also teaching them art, music and photography that culminates in a presentation of their work to their communities via mural arts, photography books, fashion capsule collections, exhibitions, etc. Communities are ultimately strengthened and boosted through this process.



We start by choosing our international partner organizations very carefully. Beauty For Freedom has a strict vetting process (see FAQ page). The on-the-ground partners identify high-risk youth and survivors who are recovering from the horrors of trafficking. These organizations provide services that include education, health care needs, nutritional support, recreational facilities, legal aid, and advocacy.

REDEFINING FREEDOM THROUGH CREATIVITY:

Since survivors of human trafficking and at-risk youth we serve have very limited access to education and lack skills, our workshops are designed to fill this gap and equip them with skills through the creative arts.

We bring in experts from around the world who teach various art related courses to participants. Participants greatly benefit as they learn to open up and articulate their emotions. They create beautiful, though-provoking artworks which are a reflection of their life experiences. Their artworks become an excellent source of income as they can sell their art pieces and raise funds to support their educational and personal needs.

We culminate our Art Therapy workshop series with a community art, mural, and a photography exhibit where participants' artworks are showcased for their community, family and friends. Additionally, their artworks are sold globally which benefits them significantly and supports the cause of human trafficking. Based on our experience our Art Therapy workshop series have proved to be a great platform for survivors and at-risk youth that help redefine themselves.





Benefits for participants:

- Nurture Mindfulness: Survivors learn how to focus in the present moment. This ability to be fully present and attentive is an act of mindfulness
- Personal Development: Improved leadership, empowerment, and interpersonal skills
- Confidence Building: Motivation developed through the creative process helps survivors work harder in other areas of life with greater confidence and competence
- Cathartic Relief: The experience of cathartic relief.

Breaking the cycle of pain through healthy and productive activities can help survivors gain skills to seek out positive creative activities in their lives when they feel overtaken by emotions /when they feel emotionally vulnerable



BEAUTY FOR FREEDOM DESIGN ACADEMY AND YOUTH
LEADERSHIP MENTORING PROGRAM
(US- HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS)

Our programming in the U.S. focuses on Youth Education & Mentorship for high school and college students. We have partnered with local nonprofit organizations that address issues such as domestic and sexual violence, youth empowerment and equality.

Our 10-12 week mentoring and leadership program curriculum teaches life skills to high school and college students through our mentorships and workshop series. This platform cultivates change-making ideas as our students execute their own ideas for advocacy campaigns and product lines supporting human rights activism. The youth are nurturing their advocacy and activism skills as they empower and support local non-profits, on-campus youth groups, local advocacy platforms and their own hopes and dreams of changing the world.

Our students are encouraged to utilize their innovative ideas on philanthropy and advocacy in a creative open space and to collaborate with fellow classmates building confidence and a sense of community within their teams and schools. A large part of our Beauty for Freedom platform includes mentoring and nurturing high school students and college students engaging them in advocating for human rights as equal rights. These youth are uplifting their schools with positive messaging around equality, tolerance, freedom and many other issues affecting communities locally and globally. They are the future voices for global issues.

CAMBODIA - AFESIP

Cambodia is ranked third in the world for prevalence of modern day slavery among its population. It is a source, transit, and destination country, where men, women and children are at extremely high risk of being trafficked for sex or forced labor. The sex industry, while largely operating underground, preys upon the poor and most vulnerable—women, adolescent girls, and even young children. Forty years later, the country is still recovering from a brutal genocide (1975-79) and its aftermath which killed 1.7 million of the population.

Debt plays a significant role in Cambodia's trafficking problem. The poorest families, when faced with a crisis, have a very few alternatives but to borrow from informal moneylenders who charge extremely high interest/ high interest rates. Soon the debt becomes insurmountable, leaving them vulnerable to traffickers who offer cash in exchange for a family member.





AFESIP Cambodia works to care for and secure the rights of victims and at risk of becoming victims of sexual trafficking, violence, abuse or indentured slavery and exploitation. It works to successfully in aiding victims' overall recovery and reintegration process- helping them obtain the necessary education and training and reintegrating them into the mainstream society based on financial independence in a sustainable and innovative manner.

BFF IMPACT IN URBAN CAMBODIA IN 2016

- More than 100 participants completed a total 12 classes- Art Workshops, Photography Training, and Mural Design
- Our Art program helped participants achieve self-realization as they observed their own potential in action.
- Our program helped pacify fears of failure, develop healthy coping skills, and rekindle a desire to learn more about who they are.
- Our Creative Arts program offers immense encouragement, support, and soul-refreshing, in some cases soul-searching experiences for our participants which puts them on a positive trajectory of life.

Nonprofits such as AFESIP receive our services, art supplies, photography materials, food and self-care materials for the survivors we serve through our on-the-ground in-country partnerships. AFESIP sees education and training as an opportunity for each young woman and girl to (re)build their lives. Education is a powerful tool that can improve the young woman and girl's quality of life as well as that of those around them. Education also helps break the cycle of poverty.

INDIA - NEW LIGHT KOLKATA

Of all the countries in the world, India has the largest number of people living in slavery - more than 18 million - roughly the population of New York State or the Netherlands. All forms of modern day slavery still exist in India, including intergenerational bonded labor, forced child labor, commercial sexual exploitation, intergenerational prostitution, forced begging, forced recruitment into armed groups, and forced early marriage.

Over 1.2 million children are exploited in prostitution throughout India today.

Almost 20,000 women and children were victims of human trafficking in India last year.

India alone is home to 40 percent of the world's estimated over 40.3 million slaves.

Beauty for freedom is leading the charge by implementing this programming into their platform.





Beauty for Freedom + New Light Kolkata

New Light is a registered public charitable trust operating from the terrace of a temple deep inside the red-light district of Kalighat, Kolkata that offers comprehensive community development services. The project provides the children of sex workers with a safe haven, particularly in the evening hours when the streets are most dangerous and their mothers are working.

Beauty for Freedom has been working with the New Light since 2014. We help with raising awareness, mobilizing support and producing fundraisers for New Light.

In October 2016, Beauty for Freedom travelled to Kolkata, India with a team of 9 professional artists and instructors to work with over 100 New Light Kolkata's young survivors of human trafficking and at-risk youth. Our team helped them cultivate their hopes and dreams through art, music, photography and empowerment initiatives/ activities. This was a 21 day workshop series that included vision boarding, music theory, abstract watercolor classes, and youth community activism workshops.

Additionally, a one-day conference (The "Lavanyashakti" Empowerment Initiative) was conducted at The Park Hotel Kolkata serving over 50 survivors of trafficking and at-risk youth expanding and exploring all aspects of beauty with a focus on nutrition, yoga, meditation, physical fitness, skin care, hair care, grooming and make-up application. The conference facilitated by Beauty for Freedom and New Light promoted a building of self-esteem and an appreciation of inner beauty with the survivors.

Beauty for Freedom's intensive photography program instructed 40 youth ages 9-27 over a 5-day course and yielded over 5000 images. The final collection of images and the "Illuminate" book project will be produced by Beauty for Freedom and published Summer 2017.

"Illuminate" will launch in Mumbai August 2017 with a traveling exhibition and book signing events in the US at New York Fashion Week, Boston, Houston, etc. beginning September 2017.

"Illuminate" has a transcendent quality that engages the viewer to see beyond the difficult circumstances surrounding life in Kalighat and leaves us all with a lasting impression that love truly exists in this place and that life is not as polarizing as one might think, given the fact that creativity, culture and pride thrive in Kalighat.

The photography students were welcomed into homes and gained entrance into the daily lives of the people of the community because many of the youth were born and raised in Kalighat before moving into New Light's CRECHE CUM SHELTER located as a permanent structure above a temple situated deep inside the Kalighat red light district. The shelter offers comprehensive care and support to the children ranging from a few months old to sixteen years.

"ILLUMINATE", a collection of photographs created by young survivors of trafficking and at-risk youth in Kolkata will culminate in an inspirational photography book that we will promote to raise awareness and funds for the youth of New Light.

These amazing children will become published photographers and have been empowered by the fact that their

work could possibly sustain their education for the next year. It gives them hope, as it would to any one of us for a bigger and brighter future.


